Delta Division ARES and How it Works with the Sections







What is the Delta Division?

- We have 4 States within the Division
 - Louisiana
 - Arkansas
 - Tennessee
 - Mississippi





Day to Day Operations

- Dir and Vice Dir:
 - Represent the League to the members within the Sections of the Division.
 - Review and approve requests for Hamfests and Conventions within the Div
 - Conduct Forums at Hamfests to update the members on the latest news from the Board and HQ.
 - Consult with the Section Managers and Section Emergency Coordinators on issues within their Section.
 - Have seat on the Board of the League
 - Have seats on the standing committees of the League
 - Coordinate Emergency Operations during major events

Emergency Operations

- Memorandum of Understanding
 - Mutual aid in the event of a major event within any or all Sections
 - Div Emergency Net
 - Net Manager WB4RHQ

Within each Section

 Each Section Manager maintains a list of qualified operators who may be called upon in times of emergency to assume net control.



- Each Section conducts their own net, BUT:
 - When the emergency grows to a point that they can't effectively handle the operation, or
 - When they must secure for their own safety
 - Then will contact the Div net manager to request assistance.



- Within the Delta Div, it is usually MS and LA who request assistance from the Div net for events related to Gulf weather.
- Any Section may request Div net assistance for any weather of natural disaster event.
- The Delta Div also has agreements with our adjoining Divs to provide assistance if needed. These are the Southeast and West Gulf Divs.

When has the net been activated?

 - Nate

How is the Net Activated?

- When conditions within a Section warrant, the SM or SEC will contact the Div Net Mgr or his designated assistant and request assistance.
- The net mgr will contact the SM or SEC in noneffected Sections and request they poll their list of operators and set up a schedule.



- While the SMs/SECs are setting up a schedule of operators, the net mgr will come up on the effected Section net frequency and assume net control from the operators within the Section.
- Net Mgr and or his assistants will handle the net until the schedule of operators can be finalized.
- Net operators will then each handle the net for a 2 hour periods.



- Should conditions warrant, the Net Mgr will also bring up the Div net in addition to the Section net.
- Net freqs are:
 - Daytime: 7246 or 7280(alt)
 - Nighttime: 3980 or 3923.5(alt)
